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Cedar View Celebrates its 45th Anniversary

Cedar View celebrated it's 45th anniversary with a variety of fun activities and entertainment for its residents. Some were collecting donations for Tails of Valor by "Soaking the Staff", a visit of animals from Last Chance Ranch, Karaoke, and other activities and entertainment.

Cedar View Apartments is a ten-story building containing 199 apartments that opened in 1978. Cedar View Apartments has 19 people who have been tenants for over 20 years and 17 tenants in their 90's. The oldest tenant is June Koch who is 97.











Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)

The Low Income Home **Energy Assistance Program** (LIHEAP) helps families living on low incomes pay their heating bills in the form of a cash grant. Households in immediate danger of being without heat can also qualify for crisis grants. The cash grant is a one-time payment sent directly to the utility company/fuel provider to be credited to your bill. These grants range from \$300 to \$1.000 based on household size, income, and fuel type. Remember: This is a grant and does not have to be repaid.

Alzheimer's is a devastating disease that is the most common form of dementia. It is the 6th leading cause of death in our country. Today, more than 6 million Americans are living with Alzheimer's. That number is projected to reach over 13 million by the year 2050. One person is diagnosed with the disease every 65 seconds. Did you know that 25,000 individuals are living with this disease right here in the Lehigh Valley? And some of the 25,000 are living here in our community.



People fear dementia more than they fear cancer, stroke and heart disease combined. And that fear stems from two things: one, the loss of independence; and two, a stigma which results from negative attitudes, beliefs and treatments people with dementia receive in their communities from people who do not have dementia and do not understand it. Stigma, prejudice and discrimination against people who have cognitive illnesses is universal. And this is harmful to people who have cognitive issues, and to their loved ones who support and care for them.
