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BABY BOOMERS

Individuals born between 1946 and 1964 are considered to be the "Baby Boomer" generation. In 2011, the first of the baby boomers began to turn 65. By the end of 2029, all baby boomers will be 65 and older.

Nationally: By 2040, there will be about 82.3 million older persons 65 and older (104% increase from the year 2010). People 65 and older represented 13% of the population in the year 2010. This is expected to grow to be about 22% of the population by the year 2040.



Lehigh Valley:

- The number of people in the Lehigh Valley 55 or older is expected to increase approximately 58% from 179,097 in 2010 to an expected 283,648 in 2040.
- The number of people in the Lehigh Valley 65 or older is expected to increase approximately 93% from 98,210 in 2010 to an expected 189,444 in 2040.
- The number of people in the Lehigh Valley 75 or older is expected to increase approximately 108% from 50,439 in 2010 to an expected 104,704 in 2040.



RACE AND HISPANIC ORIGIN

Nationally: In 2010, the 65+ non-Hispanic White population accounted for 80% of the older U.S. population. Blacks and Asians accounted for 9% and 3% of the older population, respectively. Further, 6.9% of the older population was Hispanic. By the year 2050, 19.8% of the older population is projected to be Hispanic, and non-Hispanic Whites are projected to be 58% of the older population.

Lehigh County: Individuals identified as Hispanic accounted for 5% of Lehigh County's total 65+ population. The non-Hispanic 65+ population is comprised of 91.6% White alone, with the remaining 3.4% divided among the following races: Black alone (1.7%), Asian alone (1.3%), two or more races (0.3%), and Other (0.1%). Further, a total of 65,615 Hispanic persons resided in Lehigh County in 2010, or 18.8% of the total county population. Of the total Hispanic population, 2,562 Hispanic persons were 65 or older, or 3.9% of the county's Hispanic population.

LABOR FORCE

Nationally: In 2012, there were about 32.4 million men and women **55 or older** in the labor force. In 2022, this number is expected to increase to about 41.8 million. From 2002 to 2012, the number of men and women 55 or older in the labor force grew by about 11.7 million, or 56.1%. From 2012 to 2022, this number is expected to grow by about 9.4 million, or 28.8%.

HOUSING

Pennsylvania provides the Rent Rebate and Property Tax Relief Program for individuals whose income does not exceed certain annual rates: \$35,000 for homeowners and \$15,000 for renters. Additionally, due to program changes enacted in 2014 to ensure claimants aren't disqualified from rebates solely because of Social Security cost-of-living-adjustments, homeowners and renters may be eligible for rebates even if their eligibility income is greater than these limits. Any homeowner who collected Social Security, received a property tax rebate in 2013 for claim year 2012 and had annual income last year—discounting half of Social Security, received a rent rebate in 2013 for claim year 2012 and had annual income last year—discounting half of Social Security—up to \$15,484, is also encouraged to apply. Rebates are

issued based on the (not greater than \$35,000 or \$15,000) income, and the rebate total cannot exceed \$650, though supplemental rebates for certain qualifying homeowners can boost rebates up to \$975. Eligible persons include those 65 years of age and older, permanently disabled persons 18 years and older, and widows or widowers 50 to 64 years of age.

Nationally: Over 4.2 million adults 65+ (9.5%) were below poverty level in 2013. Older women had a higher poverty rate (11.6%) than older men (6.8%) in 2013. Of the 26.8 million households headed by older persons in 2013, 81% were owners and 19% were renters. The median family income of older homeowners was \$34,500 and median family income of older renters was \$17,300. In 2013, almost 45% of older households spent more than ¼ of their income on housing costs (39% of older owners, 69% of older renters), compared to 45% for homeowners of all ages. Of the homes occupied by older homeowners in 2013, the median year of construction was 1972, and 2.7% had major home repair problems.

STATE PACE STATISTICS AS THEY RELATE TO LEHIGH COUNTY:

The Pharmaceutical Assistance Contract for the Elderly (PACE) provides assistance to those 65 years of age and older. Previous year calendar income cannot exceed \$14,500 for a single and \$17,700 for a couple. There were 2,437 PACE cardholders in Lehigh County as of December 2013.

PACENET is a \$500.00 deductible-type companion prescription program for those 65 years and older to those exceeding current PACE eligibility. Previous year calendar income cannot exceed \$23,500 for a single and \$31,500 for a couple. There were 4,049 PACENET cardholders in Lehigh County as of December 2013.

Total Participants: 6,151 total enrolled (some of which may be enrolled in both programs during the year). Of these total enrolled, 4,862 are actively participating cardholders.

INCOME AND POVERTY

Lehigh County: A method of evaluating the financial well-being of seniors is to look at those living at and below the poverty rate. Individuals identified as living in poverty are at risk of having inadequate resources for housing, food, health care and other needs. It should be noted the official poverty definition is based on annual money income before taxes and does not include capital gains, earned income tax credits, or noncash benefits. The U.S. Census Bureau determines poverty levels by comparing family income (or an unrelated individual's income) with a set of poverty thresholds that vary by family size and composition and are updated annually for inflation.



According to the 2009-2013 American Community Survey, there were an estimated 50,268 individuals age 65 and older in Lehigh County. The poverty status of these individuals are broken down as follows: 6% were below the poverty level (3,303), 24% were at or below the poverty level (11,951), and 70% were above twice the poverty rate (35,014). The median household income in Lehigh County was \$54,923, while the median household income for householders 65 and older in Lehigh County was \$35,288.



Nationally: In 2013, life expectancy for the U.S. population at birth was 78.8 years.

ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE

Nationally: Alzheimer's disease is an incurable, progressive disease that destroys memory and other mental functions. Alzheimer's is currently (2015) the 6th leading cause of death in the U.S. According to estimates, about 700,000 people 65+ will die with Alzheimer's in 2015. Deaths attributed to Alzheimer's grew significantly (71%) from 2000 to 2013, while deaths from other leading causes declined.

- Of the estimated 5.3 million people with Alzheimer's in 2015, about 5.1 million are 65+.
- About 3.2 million women and 1.9 million men that are 65+ have Alzheimer's.
- Older Blacks and Hispanics are more likely than older Whites to have Alzheimer's and other forms
 of dementia.
- As the population grows and ages, so will the number of people with Alzheimer's. By 2025, it is projected that 7.1 million people 65+ will have the disease, up 40% from 2015. Short of medical breakthroughs, this number may triple to 13.8 million by 2050.
- The 2015 estimated healthcare costs associated with Alzheimer's are staggering: \$226 billion, with half the costs borne by Medicare. Healthcare costs could rise to \$1.1 trillion (in 2015 dollars) by 2050.

Pennsylvania: In 2015, 13% of the senior population has Alzheimer's disease. In 2012, 3,271 Pennsylvanians died from the disease. From 2015 to 2025, the number of 65+ persons with Alzheimer's will increase by 18.5%.

HEALTHCARE/COSTS

Nationally: The need for long-term care services is expected to change dramatically as the population ages. Changing demographics, along with other factors may reduce the ability of family members to take care of elderly relatives, placing additional demands on public and private programs.

- In 2014, the number of persons 65+ amounted to one in every seven Americans; by 2030, the number will be one in every five Americans.

In 2014 ...

- 57% of 65 or older noninstitutionalized persons lived with their spouse.
- Only 32% of women 75 or older lived with their spouse.
- 28% of noninstitutionalized older persons lived alone (35% of all older women, 19% of all older men). The proportion living alone increases with advanced age.
- While a small number (1.5 million) of the 65 and older population lived in institutional settings, such as nursing homes, in 2013, the percentage increases dramatically with age, ranging from 1% for persons 65-74 years to 3% for persons 75-84 years and 10% for persons 85+.

ACTIVITIES OF DAILY LIVING

Activities of Daily Living (ADLs) is a term used in healthcare to refer to daily self-care tasks that include the following: feeding, toileting, selecting proper attire, grooming, maintaining continence, putting on clothes, bathing, walking and transferring (such as moving from bed to wheelchair). Instrumental Activities of Daily Living (IADLs) are the complex skills needed to successfully live independently that include the following: managing finances, handling transportation (driving or navigating public transit), shopping, preparing meals, using the telephone and other communication devices, managing medications, housework and basic home maintenance. In the U.S. Census information, ADLs are shown as "self-care difficulties", and IADLs are referred to as "independent living difficulties". These skills together represent what individuals usually need to be able to manage in order to live as independent adults.

Over one-third of the entire older adult population has some type of disability or difficulty that impacts daily activity. When looking at data specifically for Lehigh County, the prevalence of ambulatory difficulties among older adults is high, estimated at slightly over 20% of the older adult population. The older adult population also report hearing difficulties (over 10%), ADLs (over 5%) and IADLs (over 15%).

The St. Luke's Community Health Study provides additional information about the extent to which older adults in the Lehigh Valley are limited in a range of activities:

- **Heavy Activities**: Over fifty percent (50%) of older adults in the Lehigh Valley reported they are limited in heavy activities, such as running, lifting heavy objects.
- **Moderate Activities:** Twenty-nine percent (29%) reported limitations in moderate activities, such as pushing a vacuum, moving a table, bowling or playing golf.
- **Light Activities**: Eighteen percent (18%) reported they are limited in light activities, such as carrying a bag of groceries or walking one block.
- **Not Limited in any of these Activities:** Twenty-seven percent (27%) reported they were not limited in any of the activities classified as heavy, moderate or light.

The authors of the report placed the Lehigh Valley results within the broader context of the nation, citing the Federal Interagency Forum on Aging findings that nationally 42% of people 65+ reported some kind of functional limitation in 2007, down from 49% in 1992.

- According to the results of the St. Luke's Community Health Study, nearly one-third of adults age 65
 and older in the Lehigh Valley reported engaging in no exercise during a typical week. Only 23% of
 adults 65 and older reported exercising for at least 30 minutes at least five days per week; an additional 28% reported exercising 30 minutes at least two days per week.
- According to "Older Americans 2012: Key Indicators of Well-Being", one in a series of periodic reports to the Nation on the condition of older adults in the United States, in 2010, about 11% of people age 65 and over reported participating in leisure-time aerobic and muscle-strengthening activities that met the 2008 Federal physical activity guidelines.

Skilled Nursing Care Facilities

In 2014, there were 700 skilled nursing care facilities in Pennsylvania, with 17 facilities (6%) located in Lehigh County. There were a total of 88,063 beds in Pennsylvania, with 2,754 beds (3%) in Lehigh County. The Lehigh County total beds include those from the CH Skilled Nursing Facility of Allentown, which opened December 16, 2014. In Lehigh County, 2,561 beds were being used and 181 were unused, with a 93.4% occupancy rate (occupancy data was not available for the CH Skilled Nursing Facility).

National estimates indicate that 35% of persons age 65 in 2005 will receive some nursing home care in their lifetime, 18% will live in a nursing home for at least one year, and 5% for at least five years (Ari Houser, AARP Public Policy Institute, October 2007). In Lehigh County, 5% of the 65+ population in 2014 was 2,864 people. If there are 2,754 beds available in Lehigh County, and 2,864 beds are needed for 5% of the 65+ population, it appears there is a need for an additional 110 beds.


