

ProJeCt Services at a Glance

FOOD PANTRY

- Provides donated food to hungry people
- Funded as an interfaith food pantry in 1968, now the largest in Northampton County
- Serves approximately 500 households/month; 1200 individuals
- Staff supported by 40 volunteers
- Provides fresh produce and dairy products; nutritional information and recipes through the Fresh Access Initiative

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

- Provides emergency vouchers for shelter, work clothing, prescriptions, transportation, fuel oil, baby needs, and eye care for at-risk, low-income households
- Serves approximately 50 individuals a month
- Information and referrals
- 24-hour emergency shelter assistance (after hours)

SELF-SUFFICIENCY SUPPORT

For at-risk, low-income adults and families:

- Provides a "road map" to self sufficiency by identifying barriers and resources.
- Provides information and referrals for: career counseling, financial literacy, personal budget planning, small business ownership, mental health, legal advocacy and continuing education.
- Provides financial assistance to prevent homelessness
 - Rent Assistance
 - Utility Assistance
 - Credit restoration

For at-risk students:

- Provides school-wide life skills instruction to promote positive decision making skills
- Provides wraparound case management to children identified with academic and behavior problems with goal of achieving school success and graduation
- Provides support for more than 400 middle-school students

SCHOOL-AGE LITERACY

- Prevents summer learning loss through a 6 week fun summer program for K-4 students
- Gives one-on-one attention that is not possible in the school setting
- Significant learning gains measured by pre and posttesting
- 200+ students each summer

ADULT LITERACY

- Teaches adult basic education, GED exam skills and the English language
- Faculty and staff supported by 40 volunteers
- Year-round day and evening classes
- Prepares learners for the work place, citizenship and higher education

FAMILY LITERACY AND EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION

- Provides parents and children with literacy support for learning in the early years
- Provides care and age-appropriate literacy and social skills for babies and pre-school children
- Supports the parents as child's first teacher
