# • Patty Marth- Compliance

- Notification from Department of Human Services:
- O Bulletin OMHSAS-17-04: Physician/Certified Registered Nurse Practitioner Collaboration Procedures: In accordance with the Professional Nursing Law, and in order to utilize the full potential of a CRNP, there shall be a collaboration process in which a CRNP works with one or more physicians to deliver health care services within the scope of the CRNP's expertise and license. This policy establishes the process for ensuring a direct line of communication with a licensed physician even in the event one is not readily available at a work
- Bulletin #99-17-11: Limited English Proficiency Requirements-The purpose of this bulletin is to remind Medical Assistance (MA) providers of their responsibility to provide interpretation and translation services free of charge to all individuals who have Limited English Proficiency (LEP), vision limitations, and/or auditory limitations, and the federal guidelines that must be followed to accomplish this.

### Email blasts:

- Progress Notes no longer support the minimum documentation requirements due to the EHR's system design (please reference Magellan's Provider Handbook page 60 for the full list of documentation standards:
  - https://www.magellanprovider.com/media/1661/pa\_healthchoices\_supp.pdf). In many cases, providers were fully compliant with the requirements prior to converting to an EHR, however did not have the appropriate personnel involved in selecting a system or designing the specifications. Specific examples of adverse audit findings include: rendering clinician's credentials do not display on the progress note; and only the start time of the session appears when the requirement is that both the start and end times are included.
- Electronic Time Stamps that precede the end time of the session. This includes both the rendering clinician's signature on the progress note and any member signatures that are collected to validate the session. Please ensure that staff and the individuals receiving services sign documentation only following completion of the activity.
- Duplicate Documentation. All progress notes and treatment plans should be individualized.
   Most EHR systems have the capability to disable "pull through" or "cut-and-paste"
   functionality. We strongly recommend that providers do not allow their EHR systems to
   employ this tool as it lends itself to duplicate documentation.
