Cedarbrook: Investing in Our Seniors

- Lehigh County is moving forward with the **\$68 million** for the new wing and renovations at Cedarbrook, South Whitehall.
- Fulfills Executive campaign pledge to maintain commitment to owning and operating a quality county facility that provides outstanding care.
- Cedarbrook: 670 beds, safety net for 560 persons.

Cedarbrook: Investing in Our Seniors

- Cedarbrook ratings: 5/5 stars on overall quality, 4/5 stars on overall staffing, 4/5 stars nurse staffing
- Renovations necessary to build upon these successes.

Voter Equipment: Investing in Our Elections

- \$3.5 million committed to procuring new voting equipment.
- County complying with state-mandated direction from Governor Wolf.
- Counties must replace voting equipment by 2020, ideally in place for 2019 General Election.

Voter Equipment: Investing in Our Elections

- Machines will leave a paper trail in addition to electronic storage.
- This change is a **critical security mechanism** against hacking, and **important for the integrity of our elections**.
- County committed to ensuring every vote counts and our elections are fair, transparent and properly secured.

Courthouse Renovations: Investing in Our Services

- We are continuing renovations to the Historic courthouse, the county has allocated \$9 million to the project, it began in 2018 and will continue through mid 2020.
- \$4 million to renovate County Courthouse, the state will make a reimbursement of \$2.5 million over 20 years.
- To improve asset utilization, Domestic Relations is being relocated to the County Courthouse.

Courthouse Renovations: Investing in Our Services

- Annual Benefits: **\$75,000 in rent savings** while creating **\$150,000** in revenue each year- a **\$225,000 benefit** that provides better security and improved operations
- Upgrading the cooling system for the 1964 county courthouse: \$1.3 million
- 2019 Capital Plan also includes \$1.4 million for the court elevator system, starting early 2019.

Farmland Preservation: Investing our Economy & Heritage

- **\$2 million** allocated towards farmland preservation.
- Lehigh County ranks 4th in farms preserved and 5th in total acres preserved in PA.
- Economic and Quality of Life benefits are immense.

Farmland Preservation: Investing our Economy & Heritage

- \$91 million in Gross Domestic Product (GDP).
- Limits growth of school related expenses- farms consume 36 cents in services – a typical suburban development \$1.30 in services.
- Open space contributes \$932.8 million to valley homes within ¼ mile of preserved land.

A Fiscally Sound County: Investing in Quality Services & Stability

- 2019 Budget contributes \$13.75 million to Employee Retirement Plan. The plan is
 87.9% funded.
- Employee growth number: **39** new employees added, mostly from 9-1-1 consolidation.
- Total Employees: 2,003

A Fiscally Sound County: Investing in Quality Services & Stability

- Majority of positions added were the result of state-mandated 9-1-1 consolidation. Lehigh County added 34 9-1-1 positions.
- County Stabilization Fund Balance: \$19.6 million.
- County healthcare costs have remained steady.

County Finances: Investing in Long-Term Stability

- Total County Budget: \$506,185,110.
- Total County Tax Dollars: \$112 million.
- County Millage Rate Return to 3.79.

County Finances: Investing in Long-Term Stability

 Based on the median Lehigh County Property assessed at \$203,000 the proposed 2019 Lehigh County Property Tax would be \$769.37 per year.

Return to Previous Millage Rate Explained

- As an elected official I'm required to make **tough**, **pragmatic and responsible decisions**.
- Good governance isn't a popularity contest, it's about delivering quality and vital services to our constituents.

Return to Previous Millage Rate Explained

- County will fund projects with direct cash from operating revenue as opposed to financing revenue.
- \$7.7 million budgeted in capital expenditures for 2019.

- State-mandated voting machine purchases.
- Reduced Revenue from Holding Fees at County Jail.
- Pension and Healthcare Costs
- Salaries and Wages
