## II. Provider Forum

## Salisbury Behavioral Health – Ashley Lerner

- Salisbury's Blended Case Management Program is partnering with Northampton County Juvenile Probation to provide services to children living with a mental illness and their families. Services are targeted to individuals involved in the criminal justice system or family court. The referral process is unchanged.
- Additionally, Forensic Intensive Case Management as a specialty service is being developed with Northampton County DOC. Staff are attending a safety training for jail-related work.
- Salisbury's Psych Rehab Program is now serving the Transitional Aged Youth population, operating two days per week out of the Chew St. and Unity House locations. Targeted ages for TAY population is 18-26.

## NET Services – Fred Brown

- $\circ\,$  Updated service offering/brochures were supplied.
- Specialized IOP/OP tracks are being explored to address the unique needs of adolescents, targeting the summer months when school is not in session.

## o Merakey Wellness Recovery Team – Christine Higgins

 Wellness Recovery Team current census is at 40 HealthChoices Members. The program is growing and expected to achieve 80 HC enrollments at a point in time. To accommodate growth, the team is expanding to include a second Behavioral Health and Nurse Navigator. Referrals are being accepted.

## • Kidspeace/Orchard Behavioral Health – Jackie Vasko

 Orchard Behavioral Health Outpatient Clinic in Allentown is prepping for DHS walk-though as part of a planned move and expansion effort to provide Mental Health OP and Drug and Alcohol IOP/OP services. The location of services will move from Sigal Center to inside Saint Luke's at Sacred Heart Hospital campus. Kidspeace Orchard Behavioral Health anticipates services to be available beginning July 2018.

## • Valley Youth House – Barbara Vaupel

 Valley Youth House is the selected provider of Transitional Aged Youth Certified Peer Specialist services as part of the Lehigh and Northampton HealthChoices program Request for Information process. The pilot program is in beginning stages and has submitted a program services description to OMHSAS and Children's Bureau for approval.
