The Lehigh County Office of Aging and Adult Services, Lehigh Valley Center for Independent Living (CIL), Lehigh County Apprise, and Jewish Employment and Vocational Services (JEVS) are the core partners for the Lehigh County LINK.

This is a collaborative effort funded by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Office of Long Term Living (OLTL) to provide information and linkages to long-term service and supports for people over 60 and persons between the ages of 18 and 59 with disabilities.

A knowledgeable network of partnering agencies will provide supportive service to the target population within Lehigh County. Information and assistance on services will be provided for both private pay and publicly funded individuals.

There is no charge for assistance provided by the Lehigh County Link to Aging and Disability Resources although some service agencies may charge fees.

How can LINK assist you?

- Make connections with organizations that provide needed services
- Assist with applications to determine funding eligibility
