National Hispanic Heritage Month

Each year, Americans observe National Hispanic Heritage Month from September 15 to October 15, by celebrating histories, cultures, and contributions of American citizens whose ancestors came from Spain, Mexico, the Caribbean and Central and South America.

The observation began in 1968 as Hispanic Heritage Week under President Lyndon Johnson and was expanded by President Ronald Reagan in 1988 to cover a 30-day period. It was enacted into law on August 17, 1988.

The day of September 15 is significant because it is the anniversary of independence for Latin American countries Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Hondu-

ras, and Nicaragua. In addition, Mexico and Chile celebrate their independence on September 16 and September 18, respectively. Also, Columbus Day or Dia de la Raza, which is October 12, falls within this 30 day period.

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Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP)

Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP) is in place to provide families and individuals financial assistance for rent including: rent, rental arrears, utilities, and home energy costs incurred due, directly, or indirectly to COVID-19.

Client must be able to prove this financial loss via paystubs, bank statements, unemployment award letters, etc.

Documentation needed for Emergency Rental Assistance:

From Tenant:

- Copy of ID or License
- Copy of Current Lease
- Unemployment letter, if on Unemployment
- Paystubs pre and post COVID
- Utility Bill showing arrears
- Completed application

From Landlord:

- Completed Landlord portion on Application
- Proof of ownership of property (deed, insurance, taxes, etc.)
- W9 Form

Application processing time is between four to six weeks.

For so many, the pandemic continues to eliminate inperson group interactions. Senior CHAT links older adults with caring volunteers through friendly phone conversations that can help re-

duce isolation and promote well-being.

We all know the value of human connections. Now, more than ever, we need our community to come together and lift each other up—one phone call at a time.

Senior Corps RSVP of Lehigh, Northampton & Carbon Counties, teamed with ShareCare Faith in Action and supported by Lehigh County Aging and Adult Services, launched Senior CHAT. They are matching caring volunteers willing to make a weekly phone call with area seniors who feel 'disconnected.' Volunteers are asked to make a six-month commitment and be at least 18 years old.
