SMP SCAM WATCH: COVID-19 VACCINE

Be on the lookout for COVID-19 scams:

- You *likely* will not need to pay anything out-of-pocket to get the vaccine during this public health emergency.
- You cannot pay to put your name on a list to get the vaccine early.
- No one from Medicare or the Health Department will contact you.
- Beware of providers offering other products, treatments, or medicines to prevent the virus.
- No one from a vaccine distribution site or health care payer will call and ask for your Medicare number, Social Security number, or banking information to sign you up for a vaccine.

Signing up to be a Senior CHAT caller is a fun and rewarding way to give back and support the older adults in our community. Callers must be at least 18 years of age and commit to calling their match once a week for at least 6 months.

Engage with a community volunteer in weekly phone calls. Share your stories, reminisce, chat about shared interests and experiences, laugh and enjoy each other's company. Connect and enjoy conversations with someone who cares!

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Become a Dementia Friend

What makes you a Dementia Friend?

You become a Dementia Friend by attending a onehour informational session to learn about living with dementia and simple things you can do to support someone living with the disease.

What happens at the information session?

The one-hour session is led by a Dementia Friends Champion. It is not a training session. You'll learn what dementia is, what it's like to live with the disease, and some tips for communicating with someone with dementia. Evervone who attends is asked to turn their new understanding of dementia into a practical action that can help someone living in your community. The action can be as big or as small as you choose—every action counts!

Dementia Friends is a global movement that is changing the way people think, act, and talk about dementia. Developed by the Alzheimer's Society in the United Kingdom, the Dementia Friends initiative is underway in Pennsylvania and across the United States. By helping everyone in a community understand what dementia is and how it affects families, each of us can make a difference for people touched by dementia.

The SOLO guide is designed to go beyond physical safety reminders during the COVID-

19 pandemic and demonstrate ways to combat stressors and live healthy lives.

Tools available in the guide are:

- 1. Activities and videos to stay mentally, physically, and spiritually fit.
- 2. Resources to assist with these three areas.

3. Short questionnaires to build active health plans.

Grandparent/Older Adult Relative Caregiver Support Program

GRANDPARENT/OLDER ADULT RELATIVE CAREGIVER SUPPORT PROGRAM



What is this program?

The Grandparent/Older Adult Relative Caregiver Support Program allows older adult caregivers of children to be reimbursed for normal school and extracurricular activity expenses, along with any medical consumable supplies that may be needed for a child with medical care needs. Consumable supplies are expendable items needed on an ongoing basis to provide care to the care-receiver. Caregivers receive reimbursement for their out-of-pocket expenses. Prescriptions or pharmaceutical items are not included.

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Some items permitted for reimbursement include:

- Baby food/formula
- Extracurricular activities fees
- Recreational activities
- Uniforms
- School expenses
- Seasonal Clothing
- Vitamins
- Nutritional supplements
- Disposable undergarments
- Liquid drink supplements
- Child care services for respite care
- Summer camp/after school programs
- Assistive devices
- Some home modifications
- Respite services
- Non-relative private pay helper

Eligibility:

-Caregiver is age 55 or older and is the primary caregiver for a child related by blood, marriage, or adoption; but not the biological parent.
-Household income level is at or below \$65,513 for 2 people or \$82,537 for 3 people (scale based on 2020 income).
-Child is age 18 or younger and resides with the caregiver.

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Pennsylvania Link to Aging and Disability Resources, commonly referred to as PA Link, is a cross-age system network of partner agencies who collaborate to service individuals who need long term care services and supports. The "no wrong door" approach attempts to minimize duplication of efforts by both consumer and provider.
