- Almost 30 years of emergency services experience (Paramedic and Firefighter)







### Staff

- In addition to Coroner Minnich, our staff consists of 14 full time employees (Supervisory, Administrative, Morgue and Investigations)
- 7 part time employees (Investigations and Morgue)
- All investigative staff members are state certified. Over 75% are also nationally certified or in the process of attaining national certification















#### Role of the Coroner's Office

- Six basic functions
  - Determine Cause & Manner of Death
  - Identify the decedent
  - Notify the legal next of kin
  - Prepare a report regarding the investigation
  - Account for and safeguard property of the decedent.
  - Provide assistance to families



#### Role of the Coroner's Office

- PA Law regarding Coroners
  - Title 16 § 1218-B
    - Coroner shall have view of the body and investigate deaths that occur in the County, regardless of where the Cause occurred
    - Determines need for an autopsy
    - Indicates types of deaths that shall be investigated (sudden / unexplained, violent / traumatic, drug related, in custody, public health concerns, child death, deaths to be cremated).




#### Statistics

- 2020 Total Investigations -8,886 (20.5% increase from 2019)
  - 1,159 scene / hospital cases
  - 4,221 referrals from hospitals, hospice and nursing homes
  - 3,506 cremations
  - 326 autopsies performed
  - 15% of scene / hospital cases are drug related
  - 5% of scene / hospital cases are suicides



# COVID 19 Impact


- 1,165 total COVID deaths reported to our office

- 61% of county residents lived in LTC





### Forensics Center

- Forensics Center opened in October 2014
- Shared facility with Cetronia Ambulance Corps, Lehigh County Coroner's Office, Lehigh County District Attorney's Office Ballistics Lab and Lehigh County Special Operations Team

#### Forensics Center

- State of the art forensics facility with capability to store over 40 decedents
- Ability to perform 3 simultaneous autopsies
- Secure storage of evidence and personal effects
- Ability to perform digital x-rays onsite
- Ability to view decedents to families as means of identification


